#### Patrick Henry Leadership Awards

The Society is pleased to announce our 2024 Award recipients:

#### **Bob Krick & Art Taylor**

Bob is best known to Society members as Historian with the Richmond National Battlefield Park where he served from 1991 until his retirement this year. Thank you for your service and congratulations!

An avid book collector, Bob has a number of published works to his credit, including:

- The 40th Virginia Infantry (1985)
- Staff Officers in Gray (2003)
- Essays in seven volumes of "The Military Campaigns of the Civil War" series
- Other published essays and a great many forewords and introductions

Art is primarily known for his tenure of six terms as President of the Society. In 2010, he and Chris Peace initiated the Patrick Henry Leadership Award program. He has worked with various preservation groups, including the Friends of the North Anna Battlefield.

Art, who considers himself to be a student of history with a focus on Hanover County, assisted Bill Winfrey with family cemetery documentation and has contributed articles to the Society's *Bulletin*. He has also published:
